Supporting a Grieving Family

How to Help

- Be supportive, visit or call to say "I care and I want to help."
- Treat the bereaved couple equally. Men need as much support as women
- Be available. Parents need direct help-providing a meal, doing errands, babysitting other children.
- Allow the parents to talk about their child; ask but don't pry.
- Learn about the grieving process. There are many resources available.
- Don't be afraid of reminding the parents about the child.
 They have never never forgotten, and letting them know you remember is comforting.
- Be liberal with touching the grieving parent. They often have a need for contact.

What to Say:

- I'm sorry.
- I'm so sad for your loss.
- · How are you managing all of this?
- What can I do for you?
- I'm here and I want to listen.
- Talk as long as you want. I have plenty of time.
- You don't have to say anything at all.

What NOT to say:

- It all happened for the best.
- You're young, you can have others.
- Now you'll have an angel in heaven.
- You're better off having this happen now, before you knew the baby.
- This was God's way of saying something was wrong.
- You should feel lucky you are alive.
- Forget it. Put it behind you and move on with your life.
- I understand (If you have not had a similar experience.)
